Message: Grace Not Received in Vain

Text: 1 Corinthians 15:9-10

"⁹For I am the least of the apostles, unworthy to be called an apostle, because I persecuted the church of God. ¹⁰But by the grace of God I am what I am, and his grace toward me was not in vain. On the contrary, I worked harder than any of them, though it was not I, but the grace of God that is with me." **1 Corinthians 15:9-10**

Grace is the empowering work of the Holy Spirit considered as unmerited favor in light of the work of Christ upon the cross.

1. This grace was not received in vain because it led to a life of thanksgiving.

Colossians 2:6-7

1 Timothy 1:16-17

2. This grace was not received in vain because it compelled Paul to be a man of joyful labor.

"These good works, done in obedience to God's commandments, are the fruits and evidences of a true and living faith. By them believers:

- make known their thankfulness
- strengthen their assurance
- edify their brethren
- adorn the profession of the gospel
- stop the mouths of the adversaries
- and glorify God, whose workmanship they are, created in Christ Jesus for good works, so that, having their fruit to holiness, they may have the goal, eternal life.

Their ability to do good works is not at all from themselves, but wholly from the Spirit of Christ. Also, so that they may be enabled to do good works, in addition to the graces they have already received, they need an actual influence of the same Holy Spirit to work in them to will and to do his good pleasure. Yet are they not to grow negligent based on this, as if they were not bound to perform any duty unless they receive a special motion of the Spirit; instead they ought to be diligent to stir up the grace of God that is in them." Westminster Confession of Faith, Chapter 16,

paragraphs 2 & 3

"For by grace you have been saved through faith. And this is not your own doing; it is the gift of God, not a result of works, so that no one may boast. For we are His workmanship, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand, that we should walk in them." **Ephesians 2:8-10**
